

High School Civics


- 3 Branches of Government (executive, judicial, legislative)
- Executive orders, supreme court decisions
- Local government loosely based on "King's law" from England, however locals are elected instead of appointed.
- Agencies are tasked with making rules to administer laws
- Some Federal laws are passed to state, and state laws are passed to local government





A Visual Representation

- Top (federal government)
- 2nd (EPA and Corps)
- 3rd (State Agencies DNR, IDEM
- Bottom (drainage board and surveyor)



What, Who, and Why does Drainage Board and Surveyor have Jurisdiction of

- County Regulated Drains (court ditches, legal drains, petition ditches......)
- In limited Circumstances, Private and Mutual Drains
- County Surveyor is the "Technical Authority"
- Drainage Board acts in both a "judicial" and "executive" capacity
- "drain would be of a public utility"

County Surveyor

- Elected to a 4-year term (no term limits)
- Technical Authority (just the facts)
- May have Qualified deputy that is a PS, PE
- Is a project feasible, how much will it cost, who drains into the watershed, what are the design standards used?



County Drainage Board

- 3 or 5 member board
- At least 1 member shall be a county commissioner
- Acts in a judicial fashion for hearings
- Acts in an executive fashion for bids, contracts, ect.





What Local Government "Regulates"

- Maintenance
- Encroachments
- Finances
- Connections
- Obstructions
- Crossings
- (Getting approval from local agency does not eliminate need for higher level permitting)
